

Northern Kyoto, which faces the Sea of Japan. The culture of people living with the sea has a different kind of charm than tourism within Kyoto City.

Yuhigaura

Meaning "evening sun shore" in Japanese, this beach truly lets you gaze at the beautiful evening sun. The setting evening sun soothes visitors. Yuhigahara Onsen, a hot spring known to have beautifying effects, is also located nearby. <Access> Around 10 min. by bus from Yuhigaura-Kitsu-onsen Station (Kyoto Tango Railway)





Amanohashidate

A beautiful landscape created by nature, with an expansive line of around 6,700 pine trees. The name means "bridge to the heavens in Japanese" - turn your back and look at it through your legs and it looks like a bridge to the heavens. <Access> Around 5 min. walk from Amanohashidate Station (Kyoto Tango Railway)





The southwest of Kyoto, featuring many romantic historical spots. The beautiful bamboo forests and autumn leaves purify the hearts of travelers.



Chirimen Kaido

The birthplace of Tango Chirimen, a high-quality silk fabric. The townscape of its time is preserved, with many precious buildings remaining. This area is also called a roofless museum of architecture. <Access> Around 10 min. by taxi from Yosano Station (Kyoto Tango Railway)



Maizuru Red Brick Park

A complex using the red brick warehouse, a National Important Cultural Property, Visitors can enjoy a wide range of things here, including a museum where you can learn about the history of bricks, and restaurants where you can enjoy fresh seafood. <Access> Around 20 min. walk from Higashi-Maizuru Station (JR Maizuru Line)



Take-no-Michi (The Bamboo Path)

A bamboo forest in the hills of Nishiooka, known throughout Japan as a production area for quality bamboo. This bamboo path is 1,800m long and features 8 kinds of bamboo fences orderly lined up, including ancient mound fences, furniture and fences. <Access> Around 30 min. walk from Katsuragawa Station (JR Kyoto Line)



Woodland Kyoto

Beautiful unspoiled landscapes of Japan, such as rich nature and tranquil Satoyama areas.

A forest of healing and creation awaits you.

Fukuchiyama Castle

This castle began when it was built as a base for Akechi Mitsuhide, who conquered Tamba Province. The stone fences remaining from the time the castle was built, and the sole castle tower in northern Kinki, are both very appealing. <Access> Around 10 min. walk from Fukuchiyama Station (JR Fukuchiyama Line)



Ayabe Rose Garden A rose garden opened by citizen

volunteers. Around 1,200 colorful, stunning roses bloom during the rose festivals held in spring and autumn every year. <Access> Around 10 min. walk from Ayabe Station (JR San-in Line)



including the Imperial House of Japan, to be a place of prayer that cured eye diseases. In recent years, it has become popular as the temple where flower water, which is colorfully decorated with seasonal flowers, originated. <Access> Around 15 min. by taxi from Nagaokakyo Station (JR Kyoto



Hozu-gawa River Boat Ride

Go down a mountain stream that stretches around 16 km, from Tamba Kameoka to Arashiyama in Kyoto. Get on a boat handled by a skilled boatman and enjoy a 2-hour boat trip that lets you experience the splendid seasons and magnificent nature. <Access> Around 8 min. walk from Kameoka Station (JR Sagano Line)



Thatched Village (Kayabuki no Sato)

A village that has houses with Kayabuki roofs (thatched roofs), built with traditional techniques, still standing. You can gaze at unspoiled Japanese landscapes surrounded by beautiful nature, where time flows slowly. <Access> Around 60 min. by bus from Hiyoshi Station (JR San-in Line)



Kyoto Miyama Tourism Association

Asahi Group Oyamazaki Villa Museum of Art

This museum consists of a main building built during Japan's Taisho and Showa Eras in the 20th century, and a new building designed by the architect Tadao Ando. Monet's painting "Water Lillies," as well as artworks related to the mingei folk art movement, are displayed here. <Access> Around 5 min. by free shuttle bus from Yamazaki Station (JR Kyoto Line)


Iga-ryu Ninja Museum


